2	 Minutes from Previous Meeting & Matters Arising – 24 November 2020 The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. Matters arising (not covered elsewhere) Right turn re-instatement / roundel at Moseley traffic lights. This is unlikely to be re-instated, cost is too prohibitive. This remains an ambition for MF either via a traffic light or roundel. JA - a thank you to all who helped deliver Churches Together Christmas cards. 	
3	Update from BS4M Tranche 2 funding confirmed. The area is now KH and Moseley – bounded by Wake Green Road/ Yardley Wood Road. Tender for consultants underway. Letter to households proposed in February.	
4	 Boundary changes Presentation by David Murray. 2023 Constituency Review – 2-year process with new constituencies to be submitted in July 2023. In West Midlands two constituencies will be lost - 59 down to 57. Electorate has gone up 686,804 to 722,447, there will need to be c. 72k per constituency. Birmingham has 69 councillor wards / 10 constituencies. Councillor Wards – 32 are 2 members, 37 are 1 member - 101 councillors in all. 9 constituencies will need 10 councillors, one 11 councillors. Boundary review – some changes required to get to the right number of electorates. Moseley Forum should monitor the process and await the Boundary Commission review. Initial proposals to be available in Summer 2021 followed by a 12-week consultation, MF should assess opportunities.
