MF (DI) to invite Simon Foster and police officers to a future meeting, subject of future meeting to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Feedback and update on prosecutions for noisy exhausts – encouraging community to report incidences of illegal exhausts• Speeding – what is being done to crack down, note a lot of incidences happen in the early hours. Reports from across our neighbourhood - Yardley Wood Road, Wake Green Rd, Salisbury Road, Russell Road, Billesley Lane, Oxford Rd, Valentine Road, Springfield Rd and many others. Highest speeds on Salisbury (with fatalities); most crashes possibly on Billesley Lane.
