	'Moseley local centre' cycle route links up with 'Cannon Hill Park to Moseley' route which comes up Park Hill and into Chantry Road. Chantry Road will be an advisory route, there will be no specific infrastructure (i.e. cycle lanes) but will be signed as a cycle route.	
	Comments from the audience about: - Pedestrian safety - crossing from footpath, across cycle lane on A435 and at slip road.
