3 Low Traffic Neighbourhood

The results of the public consultation regarding the proposed tranche 2 measures have now been released by BCC. There remains significant confusion on the 'what next?'. MF will write to BCC to seek clarification on the process for LTN Tranche 1 and Tranche 2 to include:

i) ETRO

The results of the Be Heard consultation on the first 6 months of the ETRO have not yet been published by BCC. These were promised over a year ago. When will they be published? Is the publication of the public consultation part of the process of making the ETRO permanent? If it is, does the fact that they have not been published impact the process of the making the ETRO permanent?

ii) Tranche 1. ETRO to TRO

What is the process for making permanent the existing measures?

What is the timeline for same?

When can the community comment on this specific action as part of the process?

What form will consultation/communication take (e.g., when are BCC putting up notices regarding the permanent order? What is the mailshot distribution in Moseley for the 'notification' and timing of same?)

iii) TRO

We understand that an application to make the ETRO a TRO will be made by BCC in April, this is prior to the development and publication of the tranche 2 proposals.

Please can we have BCC's assurance that the TRO may be withdrawn or amended as required for Tranche 2.

iv) Tranche 2 proposals

What is the timeline for the next tranche of works?

	v)	How/when will BCC consult on proposals (pre/post installation)? BCC has advised doing nothing is not an option - to what extent will feedback from the community inform BCC going forward. Other works We are aware a number of other works are proposed in Moseley (e.g., safety measures on Billesley Lane and re-surfacing of School Road). Please can we have some visibility of what street works are being proposed in Moseley and BCC's re-assurance that the different delivery teams are talking? We have also had a request for details of how BCC prioritises repairs to roads in the area – Queensbridge Road for example has a significant number of dangerous potholes.
